Each devotional invites kids to explore the life and love of Jesus, helping them see how they can know Him deeply and follow Him closely. Whether you are using this resource in a church setting or at home, it is designed to take about five to seven minutes each week and can be used alongside your regular children's ministry curriculum.

In addition to the written devotions and prayers, short recap videos will be provided each week to reinforce the theme in a simple, meaningful way for children. These tools make it easy to guide kids through the 40 Days of Prayer in a way that feels accessible and engaging.

The Most Important Rescue

Have you ever played a game where someone had to come and rescue you? Maybe you played tag and someone had to save you from being “frozen.” It’s fun when a friend comes and sets you free, but it isn’t any fun when you are out or lose the game.

Did you know that we all need rescue, a Savior, who can keep us safe eternally?

Long ago, in the Garden of Eden, the first people God created chose not to listen to God and instead selfishly decided to disobey His command. They ate the fruit of the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. They sinned, even though God warned them it would mean death and separation.

After they ate the fruit, Adam and Eve hid. They were terrified of the awful thing they had done. They were sure nothing could save them from the punishment that they deserved. What would happen to them? What would God do? Could they hide from Him forever?

While there were very big consequences for their sin, God did something they did not suspect. He made a rescue plan. He promised them that a Savior would come

"And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they themselves also may be sanctified in truth."

—John 17:19, NASB

Set Apart for Something Special

Have you ever been chosen for something important? Maybe you were picked to be the line leader, to help pass out snacks, or to pray in class. When someone chooses you, it means they see something special in you.

Did you know that God chose you too?

The Bible says that before you were even born, God had a plan for your life. He made you on purpose—and for a purpose! He wants your life to shine for Him in a world that doesn't always know what's good or true.

But we can't live that way on our own. We still mess up, say unkind things, and think selfish thoughts. That's why Jesus not only saves us—He also changes us. That's what it means when we say Jesus is **Christ our Sanctifier**. It's a big word, but it means that Jesus makes us holy and sets us apart to live for Him.

When Jesus lived on Earth, He chose to live in a way that was completely holy—free from sin, full of truth, and totally connected to the Father. In John 17:19, Jesus prayed

for His followers and said, “I sanctify myself so that they too may be sanctified.” He was saying, “I’m setting myself apart so they can live set apart too.”

Through His Holy Spirit, Jesus helps us live differently. He teaches us how to choose what’s right, how to walk away from sin, and how to become more like Him in the way we think, talk, and act. This doesn’t happen all at once—it happens day by day as we follow Jesus and let Him work in our hearts.

This week, as we join the Alliance family in prayer, let’s ask God to keep changing us. Let’s thank Jesus for setting us apart and giving us a mission to live in a way that reflects His truth and love.

JESUS HEALS OUR HEARTS

Theme: *Christ Our Healer*



KEY VERSE

“Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering . . . by His wounds we are healed.”

—Isaiah 53:4-5

The One Who Understands

Have you ever been hurt? Maybe you scraped your knee, had a headache, or felt sick in bed. Or maybe you felt a different kind of pain—the kind that comes when someone leaves you out, says something mean, or when you’re feeling really sad.

Pain comes in all shapes and sizes. And guess what? Jesus knows exactly what that feels like.

When Jesus lived on Earth, He saw people who were hurting. And He didn’t ignore them—He stopped and helped. He healed people who were sick, made blind eyes see, and even raised people from the dead! But more than that, He healed hearts. Jesus brought peace, joy, and hope where there was fear and sadness.

Isaiah 53 says that Jesus “took up our pain and bore our suffering.” That means He carried all the hurt in the world—even the kind we can’t always see. When He died on the Cross, He didn’t just save us from sin—He also made a way for our hearts to be healed. He understands everything we go through.

Sometimes Jesus heals us right away. Other times, healing takes time—or happens in our hearts and not our bodies. But no matter what, we are never alone. Jesus is always with us, and His grace is always enough.

This week, as we join the Alliance family in prayer, we remember that Jesus is **Christ our Healer**. Let's pray for those who are sick, sad, or hurting. Let's believe that Jesus still heals—and ask Him to give peace to every hurting heart.

The Promise of the King

Have you ever waited for something really exciting? Maybe a birthday party, a trip to visit family, or a special friend coming over. The waiting can feel long—but the moment they arrive? Worth it.

Jesus made us a promise that is even more exciting than any party or trip: He promised He will come back.

You Have a Mission

Have you ever been given a special job to do? Maybe your teacher picked you to lead the line or your coach gave you a role on the team. When someone trusts you with a job, it means they believe in you.

Jesus has given us a job, too, and it is the most important mission in the world.

Before Jesus returned to heaven, He gave His disciples a clear command. He said, “Go and make disciples of all nations.” That means go and help people know Him, follow Him, and love Him.
